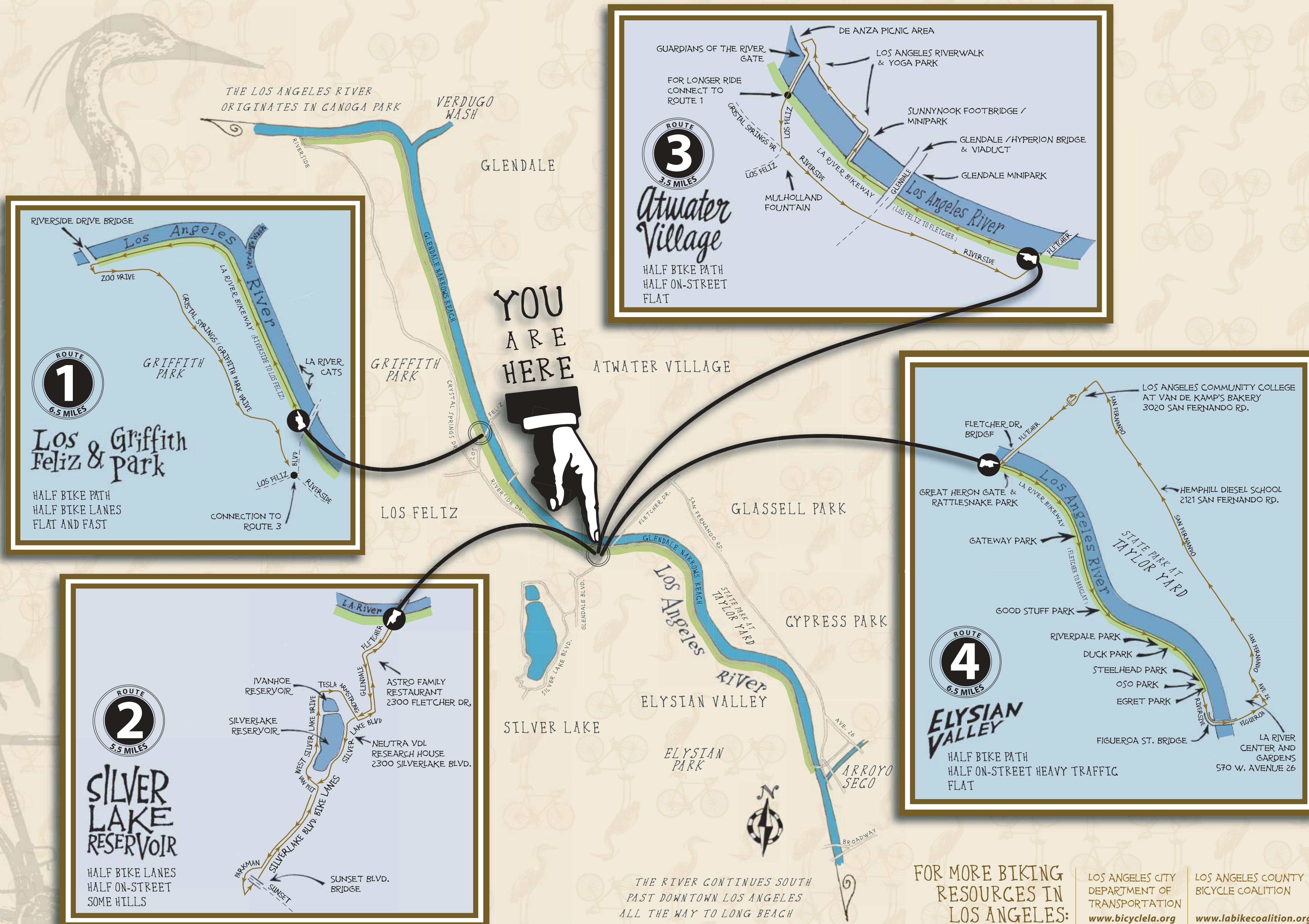


# BIKE ALONG THE LOS ANGELES RIVER



## THROUGHOUT ITS HISTORY

the Los Angeles River has been the corridor to bring culture and community to the LA basin. In the 1930 report "Parks, Playgrounds and Beaches for the Los Angeles Region" by Olmsted Brothers-Bartholomew and Associates, the river is envisioned as a location for a civic parkway lined with parks and open space corridors reaching into nearby communities. That vision is as vital today as it was back then.

## THE LOS ANGELES RIVER AND ITS DEVELOPING BIKEWAY

provide the spine for a system that links the river, communities and the larger region. Its 52-mile course flows through 12 municipalities from LA to Long Beach.

## FROM WHERE YOU STAND NOW,

cyclists can explore the communities of Atwater Village, Cypress Park, Elysian Valley, Glassell Park, Los Feliz and Silver Lake. Beyond the sycamore and cottonwood trees edging the river, there are historic bridges, parks, and vibrant pieces of Los Angeles' cultural heritage.

## FOUR FUN, EDUCATIONAL ROUTES

are detailed along this reach of the LA River. Attractions include beautiful mini-parks, river artwork, sites of the LA River State Parks, and our historic city parks, among many other things large and small.
